Dear Mr. Shankarnarayananji,

The BCCI has so far not received any directives from the Committee in terms of the order dated 21.10.2016 for the IPL tender for the IPL season 2018, appointment of auditor, setting threshold limits for financial transactions, carrying out its financial transactions etc.

The domestic season has started and the BCCI is facing issues of payments to be made mainly for the following because we are not releasing the payments to associations:

- Allowances to the players who are playing the tournament which is BCCI proposed tournament and where the association hosting such tournament is not in a position to make payment of player allowances, allowances of match officials, umpires etc.
- Payment to Hotels, airlines, ground transport agencies to whom host association is not in a position to make the payment due to stoppage of funds by BCCI.
- 3. Hosting fees payable to Associations for allowing use of their cricket infrastructure such as stadiums, grounds, equipment, etc while hosting matches on behalf of the BCCI.

For domestic season as Rajasthan association is suspended and as per the orders of the Hon'ble Rajasthan High Court, Team Rajasthan has been formed which is supervised by BCCI and BCCI needs to make expenditure on the team Rajasthan as well.

The Committee may issue suitable directions in this regard failing which the domestic cricket season shall come to a standstill.

For ensuing cricket season and also for IPL production, the BCCI requires appointment of the production crew. The crew is mainly overseas and a few are from India. The production crew for cricket is limited world over and they are required to be appointed immediately as otherwise getting them later becomes impossible. These appointments are thus required to be initiated and



completed at the earliest by the Committee failing which cricket telecast will be gravely affected. The Committee may accordingly issue suitable tender or other methodology in this regard on an urgent basis so that interest of all stakeholders in cricket is protected.

Associations such as Orissa, Hyderabad, Goa, Jammu & Kashmir, Assam have requested the BCCI to release funds for their day to day operations failing which they would not be able to operate and cricket in the region shall suffer and come to a standstill. Various other associations have to be paid for usage of their cricket infrastructure.

In addition, the BCCI is required to execute a Memorandum Of Understanding with the England and Wales Cricket Board for the upcoming England series and it entails a commitment on behalf of the BCCI for incurring expenses for English team. Kindly guide the BCCI on the terms and conditions and manner of execution of the agreement at the earliest.

Please treat this letter as urgent so that appropriate measures can be taken by BCCI under the guidance of the Committee to protect the interest of all stakeholders of cricket in India
